Information & referral

Call or visit our Centre to ask for information about our services and activities. We also provide referrals and information about community services in Bankstown.

Casework

Our caseworker assists with a range of practical issues e.g. housing, AVOs, f inances. She works with you to set goals and provides advocacy, referrals and inks to other services and information.

Groups & workshops

Our activities run within school terms and are usually free of charge. Registration is essential for most groups.

Generalist counselling

Support with emotional and relationship issues including grief and trauma. Up to 12 free weekly sessions are available for women aged 18 years or over. Women are invited to self-refer to this service (Medicare is not needed).

Child sexual assault counselling

This service is available to boys and girls aged under 18 years and to non-offending family members. Services include counselling, school outreach and advocacy.

Dietitian

Available to support you with a range of diet and nutrition issues including weight management and management of health challenges such as diabetes. You can make your own appointment: Medicare is not needed).

Women's Health Doctor (GP)

Specialising in women's health issues and screening. By appointment only on Tuesday afternoon & early evening.
(Bulkbilled through the Medicare Scheme.)

Psychologist

A psychologist practices from the Centre on Thursdays and Fridays. Referral is via your doctor (GP) who will provide you with a Mental Health Care Plan (MHCP). (Bulkbilled through the Medicare Scheme.)

Legal Aid DV Clinic

Free and confidential legal advice for women experiencing domestic and family violence. By appointment only: call the Legal Aid DV Unit on 9219 6300.
